#### Market Comment

7.01 Mnkg of tea were on offer at this weeks Colombo Tea Auction 2.91 Mnkg were Low Grown Main Grades and 2.39 Mnkg were High and Mid Grown Main Grades.

Low Growns met with fair demand. BOP1 / OP1s appreciated in value; others held firm. OPs gained in value all-round. Select best OPAs gained in value, whilst best teas held firm; poorer sorts sold at dearer rates. Pekoe's appreciated in value all-round. Pekoe1's were firm to lower. In the Tippy Small leaf catalogues FBOP1 / FBOPs sold at dearer rates all-round, whilst select best and best FBOPF1s gained in value; poorer varieties were irregularly lower. FBOPFs appreciated in value. BOP / BOPFs gained in value all-round. In the Premium Flowery catalogues long leaf and small leaf tippy teas were firm on last weeks levels.

Fair general demand at slightly lower rates prevailed at this week's Ex-Estate auction. Few selected Western BOP / BOPFs were firm but the others, below best and the bottom were lower Rs. 10 to Rs. 20 and at times even more. Hardly any Nuwara Eliya BOPs was on offer. BOPFs were irregularly lower. Udapussellawa BOPs were irregularly tending lower, whilst BOPFs lost Rs. 10 to Rs. 20. Uva BOPs were barely steady. BOPFs were lower upto Rs. 20. Medium BOP / BOPFs were lower upto Rs. 30. CTC BP1s were about firm, whilst PF1s were irregularly lower upto Rs. 30.

#### Lockdown cuts India's April tea output by 54% v/v

MUMBAI: India's April tea output fell 54% from a year earlier to 39.02 million kilograms (kg) as restrictions to curb the spread of the novel coronavirus reduced plucking in the top producing north-eastern state of Assam, the state-run Tea Board said on Monday.

For Assam alone, output in April plunged 76% from a year ago to 10.99 million kg, the board said.

In the first four months of 2020, India produced 113.36 million kg of tea, down 40% from a year ago because of lower production in March and April, the board said in a statement.

India, the world's second-biggest tea producer, exports CTC (crush-tear-curl) grade mainly to Egypt, Pakistan and the United Kingdom, with the orthodox variety shipped to Iraq, Iran and Russia.

India's tea output is likely to drop by 120 million kgs or 9% in 2020 as lockdown measures initially forced plantations to suspend plucking during the opening harvest - the prized first flush - and then operate with about half the workforce. (Source; The Economic Times).

#### India exporting tea to China and Iran despite covid, border standoff

KOLKATA: Indian tea exports to China and Iran have taken off despite the economic uncertainty due to Covid-19 and the standoff between India and China on border issues. Chinese importers are giving good prices for Indian black tea and shipments to the country have already begun.Iran, too, has started importing new season orthodox teas from last week and is paying Rs 400 - Rs 450 per kg, a price higher than that of last year.

"Border tensions between the two countries have not affected exports of tea to China," said Mohit Agarwal, director, Asian Tea and a leading exporter to China and Iran. "The Chinese are buying both CTC and orthodox black teas."In 2019, India had overtaken Sri Lanka in exports of tea to China riding on the rising demand for the Indian variety of black tea among Chinese millennials. India had exported 13.45 million kg of teas to China, whereas Sri Lanka, which had always been the leader in exports to China, was able to export 10 million kgs to the country. This year, Indian tea production has already gone down by 140 million kg due to the lockdown. (Siyaka 75 Mnkg).

The weather has not been favourable in May and June in Assam as there has been excessive rains, likely impacting overall production. Last year, India produced 1,389 million kg of teas. When orthodox teas started coming to the market in May and June, Iran was bidding for lower price. Prices of tea this year, particularly for the orthodox variety, have remained strong due to a shortfall in production.

Agarwal said that lately, Iran has agreed to pay the prevailing price which is Rs 300 per kg. "And they have placed orders too," he said. Anish Bhansali, another tea exporter to Iran, said that the Iranian importers are even ready to pay Rs 400 - Rs 450 per kg depending on the quality of orthodox teas. Last year, Iran had bought nearly 54 million kg of teas.

The exporters to Iran are not facing any problem over payment. "More or less, the payment is smooth as of now. We do not know what is going to happen after a few months," said Bhansali. Since the production of tea in India is less and there is economic uncertainty too in Iran, exporters believe that Iran may import around 45-46 million kg of teas this year, about 10% lower than last year. Fair general demand for the 192,080 packages (12,649,027.50 kilos) in the market at irregularly easier levels and 22.08% remained unsold.

The best BP1s available met improved enquiry gaining USC2 to USC30 while brighter varieties were better absorbed at USC21 to USC34 above previous rates. Medium categories were irregular ranging between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC18 with lower mediums varying between steady to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC6 and some invoices were neglected. Plainer descriptions saw an irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC14. Best PF1s in the market were irregular and varied between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC9 with brighter types discounted by USC10 to USC12 and a few lines remained without bids. Medium varieties saw less demand easing by USC3 to USC10 with some invoices neglected while lower medium sorts held steady to USC5 above previous prices but a few teas were unsold; plainer descriptions met an irregular activity varying between firm to USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC2 and plainest were difficult of sale.

The best PDUSTs on offer shed USC8 to USC11 with brighter types steady to USC6 easier while medium categories were discounted by USC2 to USC10 but a few improved lines appreciated by up to USC4 closely following quality. Lower medium varieties were irregular ranging between firm to USC26 dearer to easier by up to USC2 and some invoices were unsold with plainer descriptions varying between firm to USC16 above last rates to easier by up to USC8 and plainest were neglected. Best DUST1s available eased by USC3 to USC40 while brighter varieties held steady to USC6 dearer with medium types appreciating by USC3 to USC5 but a few lines were barely firm. Lower medium categories were discounted by USC5 to USC7 while plainer sorts ranged between firm to USC8 above last prices to easier by a similar level.

In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs were steady with PFs firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were dearer with similar DUSTs steady. Other Fannings held value while DUSTs eased. BMFs were well absorbed.

Kazakhstan, other CIS nations, Sudan, Afghanistan and Bazaar showed more interest. Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and Egyptian Packers were active but at lower levels while UK and Russia were selective. There was reduced activity from Pakistan Packers with some selective interest from Iran. Local Packers were active in line with price. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.
